Read Ephesians 2:11-22

- 1. Before Jesus came, what problems did the Gentiles face (vv. 11-12)?
- What was the importance of the Jewish custom of circumcision, according to the Law? (Gen 17:1-14)
- 3. How do you think the practicing Jews felt when the Gentiles started coming to their church, but didn't want to adopt the Jewish custom of circumcision?
- 4. What is the "dividing wall" referenced in v. 14?
- 5. What is the importance of the cornerstone (vv. 21-22)?
- 6. How has Christ destroyed hostility and made peace possible for all people?



How would a person of a different background be accepted at The Bridge? What can you do to be more welcoming and inclusive of others who are different from you?

What walls of hostility are still standing strong in your life today? How can the peace of Christ allow you to start breaking down those walls?
