Isaiah 6:1-7



▶ In Isaiah 6:1-7, Isaiah has a vision of the throne room of God. Isaiah witnesses the majesty, transcendence, and holiness of the Almighty God. In response to the holiness of God, Isaiah confesses his sinfulness. Do you think "holiness and sin" matter enough to most believers? If not, why not, and what could increase our sense of their importance?

Read Isaiah 6:1-7

- 1. If King Uzziah represents stability to Judah, what does his death mean? Why does God choose this time to reveal himself to Isaiah?
- 2. What questions about God's nature and purpose does this encounter raise for you? What feelings about God does this encounter evoke?
- 3. What makes Isaiah despair for his life and confess his sin? (v. 5; Ex 20:19, 33:20)
- 4. What is the significance of Isaiah's lips being touched with a coal from this altar?



- ▶What words/phrases describe the sinner's appropriate response to the Holy, all-powerful, and perfect God?
- ▶ How important is holiness to you? How much thought, attention, and effort do you devote to the pursuit of holiness? Are you intentional about
- putting away everything that is displeasing to God and living a holy life?
- Mow concerned are you about the holiness of the body of Christ? Does it grieve you when you see yourself or others treating sin lightly?
