## Jeremiah 31:31-34



Have you ever broken a promise or has someone ever broken a promise with you? What happened? How did that make you feel?

Have you ever broken a promise with God?

Read Jeremiah 31:31-34

- 1. What was the covenant God made with Israel's forefathers (see Gen 17:1-14; Ex 19:1-6)?
- 2. What was issue with the old covenant that prompted God to make a new covenant (see Heb 8:6-13, 9:13-15, 10:11-18)?
- 3. What does it mean that the law will be written on their hearts (v. 33)?
- 4. How will the new covenant fulfill the old one (vv. 33-34)?
- 5. How and when is the promise of the new covenant put into effect (see Mt 26:28, Heb 9:16-22)?
- 6. Does this passage mean that you don't have to share the Gospel (v. 34)? Why or why not?





Which covenant are you living under: Law or grace? How do you know for sure?

What does it mean to you to truly know the Lord as Jeremiah intended? What is God's part? What is yours?
