Luke 10:25-37



▶ In Luke 10:25-37, Jesus tells the “Parable of the Good Samaritan” in response to the lawyer’s question, “And who is my neighbor?” Who has been a good Samaritan in your life?

▶ Have you ever been helped by a stranger? Have you ever helped a stranger in distress? What happened?

1. Who do you identify with most in this parable? The beaten man? The priest or Levite? The Good Samaritan?
2. If you had been traveling down the road to Jericho and saw the hurt man, what would you have likely done? What is your general reaction to people in need?
3. What reaction would the Jewish listeners have had to Jesus casting a Samaritan as the hero of the story?
4. How does this parable answer the question, “And who is my neighbor?” (v. 29)?

▶ What grade would you give yourself over this last week for loving God wholeheartedly? For loving others?

▶ How can you and/or your community group reach out and help someone like the Good Samaritan did?
