Luke 11:14-36



In Luke 11:29, Jesus responds to the crowds' demand for a miraculous sign. What sign would it take for your generation to turn to God? What's the problem with relying on "signs" to do the trick?

Read Luke 11:14-36

- 1. How does the crowd react to Jesus' miracle (vv. 14-16)?
- How does Jesus show the foolishness of the claim that he drives our demons by Beelzebub? What does Jesus' ability to drive out demons say about the kingdom of God (v. 20)?
- 3. What is Jesus' point in vv. 24-26? To whom is the point addressed?
- 4. Why is Jesus upset about "this generation"?
- 5. What is the sign of Jonah? Who is the Queen of the South (1 Kings 10:1-15)? Who condemns whom? What is Jesus' point?
- 6. What does the light represent in v. 33? The eye? The body? The darkness?



How is the battle against evil going in your life? In the world? Are you spiritually on the attack or feeling besieged?

▶In v. 23, Jesus talks about gathering with Him in the sense of the Kingdom harvest. Does this describe your life? If not, how can you change?

Does your life reflect the light of Christ in a dark world? If not, what needs to change?
