▶ In Luke 17:26-37, Jesus talks about His second coming. Is this something you look forward to or dread?

Why? What are some areas of your life that you would have problems leaving behind?

1. What is the kingdom of God? What does Jesus say about its coming in v. 20-21? What does it mean that the kingdom of God is in their midst?
2. Are there signs that can be observed with the kingdom of God? What is the danger in looking for signs?
3. What does Jesus mean by “one of the days of the Son of Man”? How does Jesus describe it? How do we know when the kingdom will come?
4. What were the days of Noah like?(see Gen 6:11-13) What was Sodom like in the days of Lot? (see Gen 19:1-28) How will the days of the Son of Man be like the days of Noah and Lot?
5. What happened to Lot’s wife?(see Gen 19:17, 26) What is meant by the warning about Lot’s wife?
