- 1. To what town has Jesus come? How close is Jesus to Jerusalem (v. 29)?
- 2. What task does Jesus give two of his disciples? Why? What problems might they have encountered in such a job?
- 3. Why do you think Jesus arranged this "triumphal entry"?
- 4. Why do you think the crowd responded the way they did?
- 5. What kind of king and kingdom were the people expecting? How do their wishes compare to the reality of Jesus?

How will you observe Holy Week this coming week? How will you prepare to worship Jesus, our King?



As we embark on the beginning of Holy Week, read and reflect on the following prayer: "It is right to praise you, Almighty God, for the acts of love by which you have redeemed us through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord. On this day he entered the holy city of Jerusalem in triumph, and was proclaimed as King of kings by those who spread their garments and branches of palm along his way. Let these branches be for us signs of his victory, and grant that we who bear them in his name may ever hail him as our King, and follow him in the way that leads to eternal life; who lives and reigns in glory with you and the Holy Spirit, now and for ever. Amen." (The Book of Common Prayer). Following this, listen to the song, read the lyrics, and/or sing along to one of the following songs: "Hosanna (Praise is Rising)" or "We Have Come to Worship Him".
