Sermon Guide

Luke 2:41-52



At the end of Luke 2, Luke gives the account of Jesus as a young boy seeking God in His Father's house. Where do you go when you want to seek God? For you, what environment is most conducive to experiencing His presence?

Read Deuteronomy 16:1-6, 16

1. What was the significance of the Feast of Passover? Read <u>Luke 2:41-52</u>

- 2. What do Jesus' character traits revealed in this passage tell us about Him?
- 3. How much does Jesus seem to know about his mission? How much do his parents know?
- 4. Why do you think Luke included this episode of Jesus' life?



Has your hunger for God ever been misunderstood by your family? How? How do you maintain a balance between daily responsibilities and serving God?

O God, the Triune God, I want to want Thee; I long to be filled with longing; I thirst to be made more thirsty still. Show me Thy glory, I pray Thee, that so I may know Thee indeed...In Jesus' Name. Amen."
