Sermon Guide

Luke 6:12-26



▶ In Luke 6:12-26, Jesus meets with the people from "Judea and Jerusalem and the seacoast of Tyre and Sidon." Jesus provides teaching and meets their various needs for healing and deliverance. How has Jesus met you where you are? How has he met your needs?

Read Luke 6:12-26

- 1. What is significant about Jesus calling these men? What do we know about them? What surprises you most about Jesus' choice of apostles?
- 2. Who is in the crowd? Why have they come? How does Jesus meet their needs?
- 3. What four qualities ought to characterize "kingdom people" (vv. 20-22)? How would you define each of these? What blessing is promised for each? Are these present blessings or future blessings?
- 4. Who is Jesus addressing in vv. 24-26? How would you define each warning he gives here?



▶Jesus modeled a fruitful life of prayer, power, and patience. What fruit is evident in your life? What can you do to better model Jesus?

▶Jesus's life and ministry is constantly dependent on and empowered by His intimate relationship with His Father. How would you describe your relationship with God? What can you do to grow in your relationship and become more dependent on and empowered by your Heavenly Father?
