Psalm 34:1-10



► In Psalm 34:1-10, David praises and extols the Lord for his goodness and deliverance from affliction. Do you believe that God is good? In what ways has God been good to you?

Read [Psalm 34](#)

1. What prompted David to write this psalm? (Read [1 Samuel 21:10-15](#))
2. What promises do you see in this psalm? Which one has your name on it?
3. What does it mean to fear the Lord? (v. 7)
4. How could David “taste and see” that the Lord is good?

► Peter uses this psalm to comfort those who suffer for doing good. How do you reconcile the “good things” the Lord promises with the acute suffering experienced by some Christians?

► How does the Christian life “taste” to you? Why?

GLORIFY
