1. What is the goal of all redemption? What do you think it will be like living without fear, pain or death, and with the continuous and direct presence of God?
2. What makes the city brilliant? What do the twelve gates and the twelve foundations signify? How is the size and beauty of the city described?
3. What was the function of the temple in the old Jerusalem? Why is there no need for a temple in the New Jerusalem?
4. What is required to be a citizen of this New Jerusalem (21:27)? What will the inhabitants of the New Jerusalem be doing for eternity (Rev 22:3-5)?
5. What similarities do you see between the Garden of Eden and the New Jerusalem?
